Please be aware that we are no longer selling hunting and fishing licenses on behalf of the MNR. After 56 years of doing just that, it has become too much to handle. Lots and lots of paperwork and responsibilities that we hadn't had before, plus the amount of time it took to process just one license far

outweighed the remuneration received. It came down to simple math. The sentiment with all outfitters is that the MNR would like to be rid of all outside issuers and deal only with on-line licensing. With that in mind, plus it's the government after all – they are unwilling to make the necessary changes that would ease our burden a bit, so we had to make a decision. It was a hard one to make too. We've been providing this service for a very long time.

We just hope you are able to obtain your licenses. You can get them at another license issuing station between here at the border. The information centre just as you cross into Canada sells them, as does the

Canadian Carver. There are also places in White River and Hornepayne too. Of course, you're always able to obtain them at the following link online. Just be sure to have a credit card handy and if you have an existing outdoors card, you'll need that too (and a printer to print your license and/or receipt).

The largest walleye of the season went to Shawn Goulding with a gorgeous 33", 12 pounder from Fish Lake. Shawn released it for another day. On the same






